EXHIBITION: "Art Brut Biotope: Works from the Hannah Rieger Collection"



"Art Brut Biotope" is showing 77 shows by 46 artists from all over the world. This offers a unique insight into this genre. Works of *art brut*, which are becoming the focus of public attention, are also increasingly finding their way into the collections of renowned museums as well as important international art shows, such as the Venice Biennale. The exhibition also features works by all four *art brut* artists who are on show at this year's Biennale: Aloïse Corbaz, Madge Gill, Anna Zemánková and Leopold Strobl.
